[Camarillo, Calif.] — Camarillo Public Library is one of twenty libraries in the state selected to receive funding from the California State Library for programming on sustainability and climate resilience. The City of Camarillo has been awarded a \$17,325 grant to support the Library’s Cam I Am Sustainable initiative, which will feature community conversations and events as part of a Sustainable Neighborhood Series. Each month from January to June 2023 the series will focus on select topics such as composting, vegetarian cooking, upcycling, food waste, water conservation and solar energy.

“We are honored to have the California State Library support our Cam I Am Sustainable initiative,” said Library Director Mandy Nasr. “Camarillo Public Library is committed to serving as a trusted source for providing enriching programs on sustainability for all ages.”
