This workshop will include a classroom session and an outdoor session on skills training. An operational bicycle and helmet are required.



Saturday, May 31 / 1 p.m. / Community Room




Learn the art of origami in this drop-in craft program. Children will have the opportunity to transform a simple sheet of paper into an amazing creation using a step-by-step guide.

Learn about 3D printing from RCMakes volunteers! Choose a 3D design to be printed and return the following week to pick up your 3D printed masterpiece.




Asian American & Pacific Islander Heritage Month: Aloha in Motion (All Ages)
